Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) Knows NO Boundaries!

In Australia approximately 30,000 people sustain a Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) outside of a hospital and are treated by emergency medical services (EMS) each year.

That's 575 Australians suffering a SCA every week and ONLY 1 out of 10 WILL SURVIVE!



The Facts

- An average of only 9% of its victims in Australia survive!
- It can happen anytime, anywhere and to anyone, even young athletes.
- **Early defibrillation is the single most effective treatment for SCA.**
- Defibrillation within three minutes of collapse can increase the chance of survival to over 70%.

Are YOU READY, WILLING and ABLE to potentially SAVE a LIFE?

Our <u>Heart Safe Home Environment</u> from Heart Safe Australia is to raise awareness and education of the vital function that defibrillators can perform in potentially saving lives across Australia.

Defibrillators are basically a "Doctor in a box" analysing the patient's condition and providing guidance for CPR and importantly shocking the patient to restart the heart if required.

Whether you are familiar with the 3-Steps to save a life and already have a defibrillator or AED, join our Heart Safe Environment program initiative to make sure you and the people in your community are ABLE, WILLING and READY to help in such potentially very stressful life and death situation.

Heart Safe Environment Checklist to Potentially Save Lives

Audit/Check list to become a Heart Safe Environment:

- There is a Defibrillator with the appropriate signage (AED)
- The Defibrillator is in a high traffic area where it is highly visible.
- There is a Defibrillator located within 90 seconds brisk walk from anywhere.
- There is an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Policy & Procedure made aware and available to all available.
- There is adequate CPR signage highly visible.
- CPR awareness training provided to management and staff
